
Bliss



- For those who need to communicate in symbols

It is second nature to most of us to communicate with others by speech and writing. It is a basic human right to be able to influence one's life situation through communication. But in Sweden alone there are hundreds of people who lack speech or have difficulties in reading and writing, often in combination with physical disabilities. For these, Bliss provides an alternative or complement to inadequate speech.

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What is Bliss?

Bliss is a graphic language that employs symbols. It is highly flexible and has grammatical potential which enables users to develop their use of language.

Its system of basic symbols allows new concepts to be constructed and to expand the standardized Bliss vocabulary.

The basics of the Bliss system

Words are constructed by combinations of symbols rather than phonemes (letter sounds) Bliss words can be:



The basic symbols are significance-carriers and serve as the building blocks of a language of c. 4,500 words.

The Bliss system also contains a number of grammatical symbols, so-called operators, such as verbs, nouns and plural:



It is possible to construct complete sentences in Bliss:










The Air Force Museum in Linköping has included Bliss symbols on its information brochure.

The background to Bliss

Bliss was originally intended as a universal language to facilitate international communication and promote peace. The Bliss symbols were developed by Charles Bliss towards the end of the 1940s. He was inspired by written Chinese which caters for people with widely different spoken languages. In the 1970s Bliss was rediscovered by educationalists working at a rehabilitation centre in Canada. Today Bliss is used worldwide.

Bliss is owned and administered by BCI - Blissymbolics Communication International. BCI is responsible for developing the language and each year hundreds of new Bliss-words are created.


In BlissOnline you will find all authorized BCI (Blissymbolics Communication International) Bliss words for downloading.

BlissOnline works on all computers. All that is needed is an Internet link.

Bliss words are available for downloading in different formats enabling them to be used on different platforms. They can also be saved onto your hard drive. The Bliss data base has been constructed in collaboration with BCI in accordance with its directives.

Bliss words are searchable in the data base by word and grammatical affiliation. The search tools are in English and Swedish.

Initially the c. 4500 basic words are being made available, but BlissOnline will continue to expand successively to facilitate user needs.
